#### MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY AS OF AUGUST 2020



King County had **1.16 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.74 months' of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **0.69 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.47 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

# MEDIAN HOME PRICE

AUGUST 2020



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$680,000** in King County and **\$534,999** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County rose 10.89%, from \$670,000 a year ago to **\$742,950**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 13.27%, from \$490,000 to **\$555,000**.

In Seattle, the median single-family home price for August was **\$825,000**, a 8.55% increase from August 2019.

## POPULATION

The Puget Sound region's population as of April 1, 2020 was 4,264,200.

Over the past year, the region added 60,800 people, as follows:

- King County +34,500
- Kitsap County +2,100
- Pierce County +12,400
- Snohomish County +11,800




#### **BUILDING PERMITS**

The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

**4,779 Single-Family Permits** (YTD as of July 31, 2020) YTD % Change Compared to 2019: **-5%** 

**7,792 Multifamily Permits** (YTD as of July 31, 2020) YTD % Change Compared to 2019: **-19%**

### JOBS

Since 2010, the Puget Sound Region has added more than 464,000 jobs. We've added over 2.75 jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington unemployment rate for August 2020 is **8.5%** and for Seattle/ Bellevue/Everett it is **7.4%**.

Construction employment in Washington increased by 500 between July 2020 and August 2020. Total employment in construction is **212,800 statewide**.
