## MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF SEPTEMBER 2020



King County had **1.12 months' supply** of inventory (down from 2.17 months' of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **0.56 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.72 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

## MEDIAN HOME PRICE

SEPTEMBER 2020



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$698,230** in King County and **\$550,000** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County rose 14.18%, from \$660,000 a year ago to **\$753,600**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 15.74%, from \$492,500 to **\$569,997**.

In Seattle, the median single-family home price for September was **\$820,000**, a 9.33% increase from September 2019.

## **POPULATION**

The Puget Sound region's population as of April 1, 2020 was **4,264,200**.

Over the past year, the region added 60,800 people, as follows:

• King County +34,500

• Kitsap County +2,100

• Pierce County +12,400

• Snohomish County +11,800

## **BUILDING PERMITS**


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

9,019 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of August 31, 2020)

YTD % Change Compared to 2019: -17%

## **JOBS**

Since 2010, the Puget Sound Region has added more than 464,000 jobs. We've added over 2.75 jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington unemployment rate for September 2020 is **7.8%** and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **7.0%**.

Construction employment in Washington increased by 2,700 between August 2020 and September 2020. Total employment in construction is **217,500 statewide**.
