MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF JUNE 2021



King County had **0.56 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.25 months' of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **0.35 months' supply** of inventory (down from .81 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

JUNE 2021



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$779,919** in King County and **\$675,000** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County rose 18.62%, from \$725,000 a year ago to **\$860,000**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 32.13%, from \$541,875 to **\$716,000**.

In Seattle, the median single-family home price for June was **\$890,444**, an 11.31% increase from June 2020.

BUILDING PERMITS


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

JOBS



The Washington unemployment rate for June 2021 is **5.2%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **5.2%**.

Construction employment in Washington increased by 400 between May 2021 and June 2021. Total employment in construction is **224,000 statewide**.
