MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF JUNE 2024



King County had **1.9 months' supply** of inventory (up from 1.3 in June 2023)



Snohomish County had **1.4 months' supply** of inventory (up from 1 in June 2023)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

IUNE 2024



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$875,000** in King County and **\$789,497** in Snohomish County.




For single-family homes only, the median price in King County increased 3%, from \$935,000 a year ago to **\$965,000**. The median price in Snohomish County increased 7%, from \$774,975 to **\$830,000**.

The Housing Market Index (HMI) was **43** nationally, down 21% year over year.

In the West, the HMI was 41.

The HMI is based on a monthly survey of NAHB members designed to take the pulse of the single-family housing market.

BUILDING PERMITS


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

2,839 Single-Family Permits (YTD as of May 31, 2024)

YTD % Change Compared to 2023: 22%

4,926 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of May 31, 2024)

YTD % Change Compared to 2023: -8%

The Washington unemployment rate for June 2024 is **4.9%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **4.3%**.

Construction employment in Washington **decreased by 9600** between June 2023 and June 2024. Total employment in construction is **233,800 statewide**.
