#### MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF JULY 2024



King County had **2 months' supply** of inventory (up from 1.5 in July 2023)



Snohomish County had **1.5 months' supply** of inventory (up from 1.1 in July 2023)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

## MEDIAN HOME PRICE

JULY 2024



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$880,000** in King County and **\$775,000** in Snohomish County.




For single-family homes only, the median price in King County increased 11%, from \$897,500 a year ago to **\$999,000**. The median price in Snohomish County increased 9%, from \$751,250 to **\$818,419**.

JULY 2024



The Housing Market Index (HMI) was **42** nationally, down 25% year over year.

In the West, the HMI was 37.

The HMI is based on a monthly survey of NAHB members designed to take the pulse of the single-family housing market.

## **BUILDING PERMITS**


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

3,310 Single-Family Permits (YTD as of June 31, 2024)

YTD % Change Compared to 2023: 14%

5,383 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of June 31, 2024)

YTD % Change Compared to 2023: -11%

# **JOBS**



The Washington unemployment rate for July 2024 is **4.9%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **4.4%**.

Construction employment in Washington **decreased by 14,100** between July 2023 and July 2024. Total employment in construction is **227,400 statewide**.
