MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF SEPTEMBER 2018



King County had **2.83 months' supply** of inventory
(up from 1.13 months' of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **2.18 months' supply** of inventory
(up from 1.26 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

IN SEPTEMBER 2018



The median price of single family homes and condos was **\$610,000** in King County and **\$458,197** in Snohomish County.



For single family homes only, the median price in King County rose 6.88 percent, from \$625,000 a year ago to **\$668,000**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 7.78 percent, from \$450,000 to **\$484,995**.

In Seattle, the median single family home price for September was **\$775,000**, a 6.90 percent increase from September 2017.

The Puget Sound region's population as of April 1, 2018 was **4,134,660**.

Over the past year, the region added 67,860 people, as follows:

- King County +36,500
- Kitsap County +2,820
- Pierce County +12,820
- Snohomish County +15,720



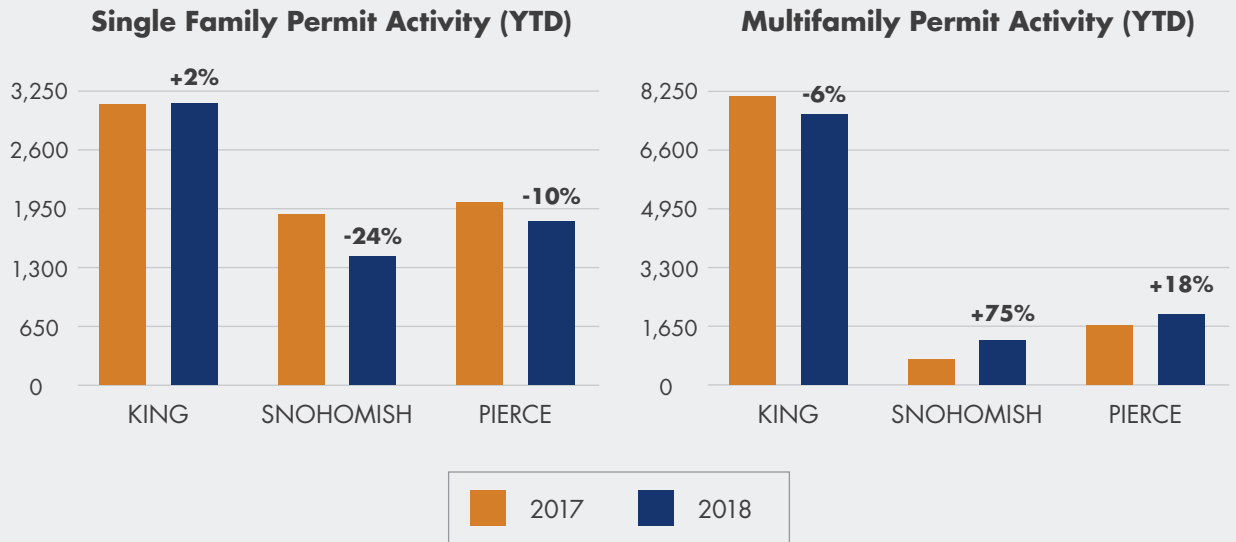

BUILDING PERMITS

The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

6,377 Single Family Permits (YTD as of August 31, 2018)
YTD % Change Compared to 2017: **-8%**

10,842 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of August 31, 2018)
YTD % Change Compared to 2017: **+3%**

JOBS

Between 2010 and 2017, the Puget Sound Region added 362,800 jobs. We've added over three jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington unemployment rate for September 2018 is 4.4% and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.4%**.

Construction employment in Washington decreased by 1,400 between August 2018 and September 2018. Total employment in construction is **210,200 statewide**.
