MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF JUNE 2017



King County had **0.84 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.02 months of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **1.01 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.17 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

IN JUNE 2017



The median price of single family homes and condos was **\$590,000** in King County and **\$420,000** in Snohomish County.



For single family homes only, the median price in King County rose 13.86 percent, from \$573,522 a year ago to **\$653,000**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 13.92 percent, from \$395,000 to **\$450,000**.

In Seattle, the median single family home price for June was **\$750,000**, a 12.53 percent increase from June 2016.

JOBS

Between 2010 and 2016, the Puget Sound Region added 301,600 jobs. We've added over three jobs for every housing unit.



The Washington Unemployment Rate for June 2017 is 4.5% and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.4%**.

Construction employment in Washington rose by 1,400 between May 2017 and June 2017. Total employment in construction is **195,500 statewide**.
