#### MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY

AS OF OCTOBER 2017



King County had **0.98 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.12 months of inventory a year ago)



Snohomish County had **1.03 months' supply** of inventory (down from 1.31 a year ago)

Many industry analysts consider a four-to-six-month level as an indicator of a healthy market.

#### MEDIAN HOME PRICE

IN OCTOBER 2017



The median price of single family homes and condos was **\$565,000** in King County and **\$415,000** in Snohomish County.



For single family homes only, the median price in King County rose 14.55 percent, from \$550,000 a year ago to **\$630,000**. The median price in Snohomish County rose 13.81 percent, from \$386,599 to **\$440,000**.

In Seattle, the median single family home price for October was **\$735,000**, a 17.60 percent increase from October 2016.

## **POPULATION**

The Puget Sound Region's population as of April 1, 2017 was **4,066,800**.

Over the past year, the region added 81,760 people, as follows:

• King County +48,600

• Kitsap County +1,710

• Pierce County +14,910

• Snohomish County +16,540

### **BUILDING PERMITS**


The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish and Pierce counties).

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## **JOBS**



Between 2010 and 2016, the Puget Sound Region added 301,600 jobs. We've added over three jobs for every housing unit.

The Washington Unemployment Rate for October 2017 is 4.5% and for Seattle/Bellevue/Everett it is **3.8%**.

Construction employment in Washington rose by 2,700 between September 2017 and October 2017. Total employment in construction is **200,600 statewide**.
